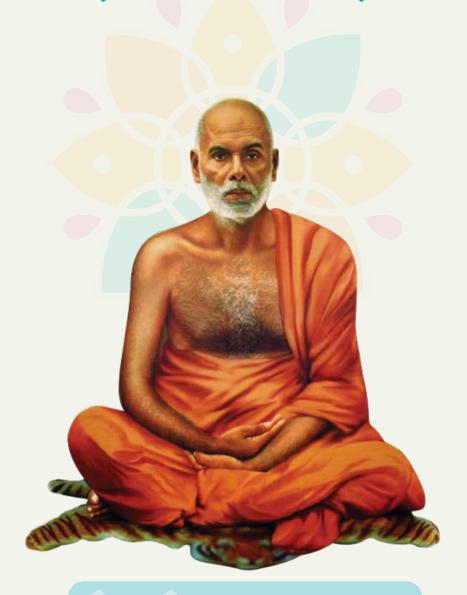


Sree Narayana Guru (1854 - 1928)

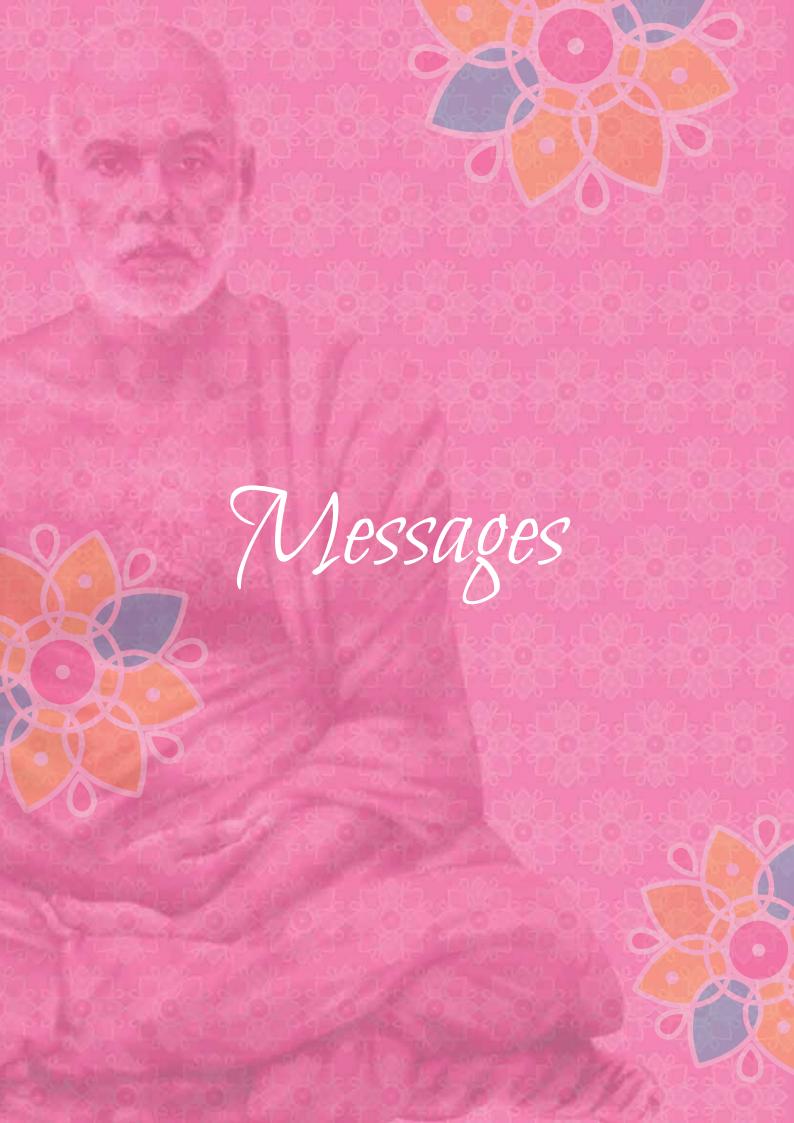

We celebrate 166th birth anniversary of Sree Narayana Guru, against the backdrop of a new normal, shaped by the COVID-19 pandemic. This year, Guru birthday celebrations or Guru Jayanthi, is a scaled down event. While we used to look forward to the annual Chathayam celebrations held over two days, this year, with the restrictions, this is not possible. However, we have made every effort to celebrate this occassion in a modest way, and engaging our members to participate virtually.

Not only Guru birthday celebrations, but all facets of our functions, activities and events across the different entities of Sree Narayana Mission (SNM) has been significantly impacted by COVID. SNM events and activities were suspended during the Circuit Breaker. However, with the gradual lifting of restrictions, scaled down events were allowed, mindful of the need to protect and safeguard the health of our vulnerable residents. SNM, very early on, implemented measures to ensure this and for business continuity. This meant that everyone in the SNM community spared no efforts to keep our Nursing Home and Meranti Home operating optimally without disruptions to key functions, while ensuring the well-being of our residents. All staff, especially Care staff made tremendous sacrifices to work in new ways to ensure that no one contracted the COVID-19 virus. SNM leadership continue to actively keep abreast of all developments and directives from relevant Ministries and Agencies, taking the lead in implementing new measures and protocols, e.g. new ways of working and delivering our services.

The Executive Committee and Sub-committee meetings were conducted virtually, even

well before the implementation of the Circuit Breaker. SNM continued to engage with its members through virtual platforms (Zoom and Facebook) and newsletters. Monthly Special Issue Darshanam provide our members with regular updates on the COVID-19 situation, initiatives and measures put in place, as well as provide useful information and advisories. Members were invited to take part in the virtual International Day of Yoga on 21 June 2020.

Looking ahead, SNM will conduct its first ever virtual Annual General Meeting (AGM) on 20 September 2020. This shift to a virtual AGM signifies yet again, a new way of conducting our business. This virtual platform will allow members who cannot physically participate in the AGM, otherwise, to join the meeting. Preliminary indications showed a positive response from members for a virtual AGM and we look forward to a good turnout at this year's AGM. To ensure the success of the virtual AGM, the management and EXCO have systematically conducted trial runs to fine-tune procedures.

While we understand that members look forward to events which they can physically attend and connect with other members socially, we hope that they will be open to new ways of engaging through virtual platforms. We also hope, through such platforms, we can get greater buy-in and participation from youth members, who will be able to drive new initiatives to support and grow the SNM brand.

On behalf of the Executive Committee, I would like to thank our members, partners, donors, well-wishers, management and staff of SNM (Singapore) for their support in helping us serve the community.

ear Members,

It has been a period of uncertainty for the world since the start of the year. When the COVID-19 pandemic first arrived in Singapore, SNM (Singapore) reacted swiftly and surely, under the guidance of the Ministry of Health (MOH), Agency for Integrated Care (AIC) and Ministry of Social and Family Development (MSF), to curtail the situation on the ground.

A Business Continuity Plan (BCP) was immediately put into place by a dedicated SNM Ops team to firstly, minimise the risk of importing the virus onto the premises, secondly, ensure that essential services and operations could continue, and thirdly, to keep our residents and staff in the SNM Nursing Home and Meranti Home@Pelangi Village safe.

Our care team rallied behind our efforts and stayed in within the premises from February until June to ensure that there is no risk of importing COVID-19 in, which can adversely affect the wellbeing of our staff and residents.

Leveraging on technology became an important facet of this unprecedented time. We tapped on the various e-platforms to ensure that we continue to operate move forward with the new norm to help bridge the physical divide for our residents, clients and beneficiaries.

Our community programmes were delivered online, and we implemented a video conferencing system to help our residents keep in contact with their loved ones. Our staff also reached out to beneficiaries and clients on a regular basis to render them assistance remotely. In the case of our Senior Care Centre (SCC) clients who were

not technologically savvy, or for those who had diminished cognitive abilities, our SCC staff created activity packs to meaningfully engage them over the Circuit Breaker period. The core goal was to ensure that our residents, clients and beneficiaries could share their concerns and feel supported.

This time of crisis has united us as a nation – One Singapore.

SNM (Singapore) would like to thank all the agencies and organisations that have donated surgical masks, hand sanitisers and temperature screening devices, as well as Care Packs to our frontline staff. Organisations have also stepped forward to help support our beneficiaries in this trying time. We also acknowledge the individuals who continue to sponsor meals for our residents and donate groceries. These meaningful donations and donations-in-kind will help us serve the vulnerable in our society.

Our regular volunteers have also found ways to keep in contact with our residents, from sending them letters, to conducting online programmes and activity sessions. We, along with our residents, are deeply appreciative of the time and effort these dedicated volunteers put in.

I would also like to express my gratitude to all staff who worked hand in hand, especially during this period, to make SNM a safe place for those under our care.

To all our well-wishers, SNM thanks you for your support and wish you a blessed Onam!

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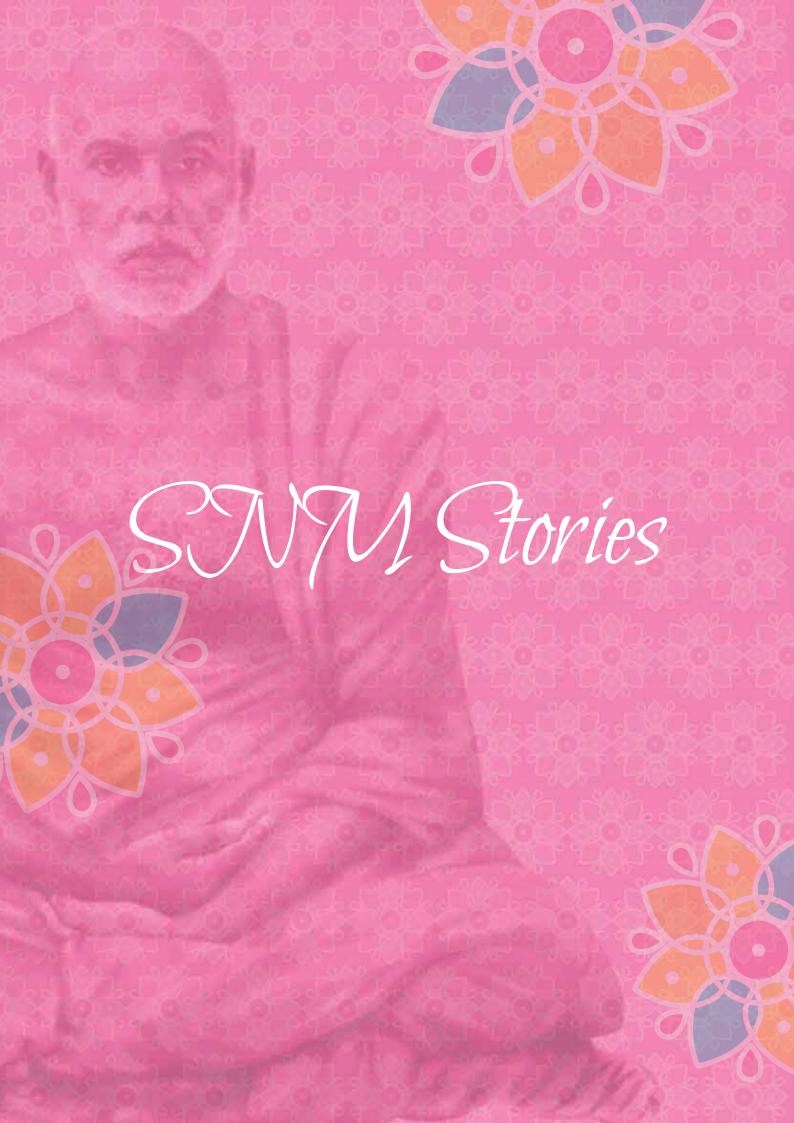

Sep 2019 - Chathayam Celebrations

The Mission celebrated Chathayam on 14 and 15 September 2019 at its premises to commemorate the 165th birth anniversary of Sree Narayana Guru. Deputy Prime Minister (DPM) and Minster for Finance Heng Swee Keat was the Guest-of-Honour for the event. The celebrations included a welcome dance specially put together by residents, volunteers and staff of SNM, presentation of education awards to students from tertiary institutions and cultural performances.

Sep 2019 - Opening of SNM Rehabilitation Centre

As part of the celebrations, DPM officially opened the 'Sree Narayana Mission (Singapore) Rehabilitation Room', which features seven new equipment specially designed for elders by the Helsinki University Research (HUR) from Finland. Three members of our Residents' Committee, Mr Tan Joo Huat, Mdm Wong Siew Sing and Mr Ishwar Lall Singh were among the residents who demonstrated the use of the equipment and how it improved their muscle strength. Mdm Wong in particular said that after using the equipment, she was able to walk longer distances without assistance.

Sep 2019 - Cyber Wellness

During Chathayam, A Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) was signed between SNM (Singapore) and DBS Bank for the 'Cyber Wellness' initiative. The initiative aims to help charities strengthen their efforts in ensuring cyber wellness, by conducting free workshops on cyber security.

We are grateful that corporates like DBS Bank have come forward to curate such initiatives for the social services sector. The signing was represented by Ms Sasha Foo Bee Chyn, Managing Director for DBS Technology Service Department, and Mr S Devendran, CEO of SNM (Singapore).

Nov 2019 - Official Opening of SNM Care Centre

The SNM Care Centre at 394 Race Course Road, officially opened on 24 November 2019. The facility, located in the Jalan Besar precinct, will help us expand our reach in the area. The Care Centre is an extension of the Mission's services, focusing on providing a wider range of programmes to the community. The Mission will collaborate with partners within the district on developing new community programmes to strengthen the social services ecosystem in Singapore.

Ms Denise Phua Lay Peng, Mayor of Central Singapore District and Grassroots Adviser to Jalan Besar GRC (Kampong Glam) was the Guest-of-Honour for the official opening of the SNM Care Centre.

Our donors, community partners and mission members were present at the opening ceremony, where they witnessed the unveiling of the plaque. This was followed by a tour of the premises. There were also programme stations, where our beneficiaries and volunteers shared with Mayor Denise Phua the positive impact of our community programmes and services.

COUID-19: A SPIRITUAL GUIDE TO OVERCOMING FEAR

For many of us, the advent of COVID-19, has brought about fear. The fear of contracting the virus, the fear of losing our livelihood, the fear of not being able to travel overseas to attend an emergency.

Is COVID-19 the cause of this fear mongering within us? Think deeply and we may come to realize that COVID-19 is just a trigger. In the past we may have encountered other instances when we suffered much anxiety.

So to overcome COVID-19 or any such triggers, we need to be able to manage this emotion called fear. Revered Sree Narayana Guru has explained the 'why' we fear and how to overcome this fear in the Daivadasakam. I shall focus on verses 1,3,5 and 10.

Verse 1

ദൈവമേ! കാത്തുകൊൾകങ്ങു കൈവിടാതിങ്ങു ഞങ്ങളേ; നാവികൻ നീ ഭവാബ്മിക്കോ-രാവിവൻതോണി നിൻപദം.

Meaning

From the most high, O Divine, protect us here, do not leave us. You are the navigator of this ocean of ephemeral becoming, and (to us) your name is a mighty steamship.

In verse 1, Man is imploring the Lord or Supreme Power to help him overcome obstacles/dangers in this ocean of life. The word "Bhavabdhi' refers to the Ocean of life. It implies the Fear in Man as he navigates his life's journey in an environment of change. The Ocean's surface is continuously in a state of flux.

We are afraid of the strong waves we encounter on the surface and even more afraid of what lurks beneath, the unknown. We are certain that we need a mighty steamship to manoeuvre this Ocean of life and we implore the Lord to be the navigator/pilot/captain of this vessel and we dedicate this Steamship to the Lord.

Verse 3

അന്നവസ്ത്രാദ് I മുട്ടാതെ തന്നു രക്ഷിച്ചു ഞങ്ങളെ ധന്യരാക്കുന്ന നീയൊന്നു-തന്നെ ഞങ്ങൾക്കു തമ്പുരാൻ.

Meaning

Ever having given us food and clothes And providing for all such needs, Making us rejoice in our contentment, You are our only Lord.

In Verse 3, we acknowledge that the food that we partake and the clothes that we adorn are the offerings of Nature. Man is unable to create anything out of nothing. He can, however, employ the gifts of nature to feed and clothe himself. However, he must put in effort to utilise the offerings of nature to provide for himself. The compassionate Guru advises contentment. Contentment is only possible if we share the benefits, that accrue from our efforts, with others. Implicit in this is that we must respect Nature and share this planet with all other creatures. If we are willing to strive to provide for society, if we have a mindset of sharing and caring, then we can be assured that Nature will make available the necessary tools for a comfortable life. We will never fear circumstances that may take away the wealth, position, or the status we have acquired. Revered Sree Narayana Guru has emphasized in his teachings that Man has let greed overcome him. Man is not contented with securing land for his use but has also exploited what is below the ground. In the process he has displaced the other creatures on this planet and altered the balance of the Environment. Conservationist have attributed the emergence of viruses like COVID-19 to humans displacing animals from their natural habitats which has caused these animals to come into closer contact with humans. Trafficking exotic animals for financial gain has also contributed to these zoonotic diseases. If Man respects nature, we will not need to fear such pandemics.

Verse 5

നീയല്ലോ സൃഷ്ടിയും സൃഷ്ടാ-വായതും സൃഷ്ടിജാലവും നീയല്ലോ ദൈവമേ,സൃഷ്ടി-യ്ക്കുള്ള സാമഗ്രിയായതും

Meaning

You are the creation, the creator too, As also the myriads of created things. You again, O God, are the Substance Of which all creation is made.

In Verse 1, we have noted that Man has a Fear of the Unknown. But if there are no unknowns, then this fear should dissipate. In Verse 5, Revered Sree Narayana Guru states that the Lord who we saw as a Power, apart from us, is actually the substance of Creation, which implies that each and every one is an embodiment of the Supreme and so are the Plant and animal kingdoms as well as all non-living things. So if the Lord is present in all, why do we need to Fear the unknown?

Verse 10

ആഴമേറും നിൻ മഹസ്സാ-മാഴിയിൽ ഞങ്ങളാകവേ ആഴണം വാഴണം നിത്യം വാഴണം വാഴണം സുഖം.

Meaning

In the deep ocean of your Glory Let us all become immersed, There to dwell, dwell forever, In Felicity Supreme!

The concluding verse 10 reveals the Truth of our Being. The Ocean of Change that Man feared in the First Stanza is the Very Source of Calmness, which you will only realize when you go to the depths. Similarly, when Man looks deep inside himself, he realizes his True Nature and then there is no more fear when he realizes the Oneness in everything. So never Fear.

I understand that Sree Narayana Guru composed the Daiva Dasakam at the request of an educator who wanted children, regardless of faith, to chant a universal prayer. The composition flowed from the lips of the Guru. In ten verses he provided the tools for a seeker to be transformed from an ignorant to a knower. Only a Realized Master with compassion can deliver this masterpiece. Our Salutations to the Guru.

മൂന്നാമത്തെ പദ്യത്തിൽ, ഞങ്ങൾ ഭുജിക്കുന്ന ഭക്ഷണവും, ഉടുക്കുന്ന ആടകളും പ്രകൃതി കനിഞ്ഞുനല്കിയ ഭിക്ഷയാണെന്ന് നാം മനസ്സിലാക്കുന്നു. ശൂന്യതയിൽ നിന്ന് ഒന്നും സൃഷ്ടിക്കാൻ മനുഷ്യൻ പര്യാപ്തനല്ല. പ്രകൃതി നല്കിയവയെ അതീവ് ശ്രദ്ധയോടെ ഉപയോഗിക്കുവാൻ അവൻ പഠിക്കണം. കരുണാമയനായ ഗുരുദേവൻ സംതൃപ്തിയടയാനുപദേശിക്കുന്നു. നമ്മുടെ പ്രയത്നഫലത്തെ മറ്റുള്ളവരുമായി പങ്കിടുമ്പോൾ മാത്രമേ നാം സംതൃപ്തരാകൂ. പ്രകൃതിയെ ബഹുമാനിക്കുകയും, മറ്റു ജീവജാലങ്ങളുമായി ഭൂമിപങ്കിടുകയും ചെയ്താലേ ഇത് സാധ്യമാകൂ. സമൂഹത്തിനായി അധ്വാനിക്കുകയും പങ്കുവയ്ക്കുന്ന മനോഭാവം വളർത്തിയെടുക്കുകയും സംതൃപ്ത ജീവിതം നയിക്കുവാൻ വേണ്ടതത്രയും പ്രകൃതി നമുക്കേകുമെന്നതിൽ സംശയം വേണ്ട. നാം കരസ്ഥമാക്കിയ ധനസ്ഥാനമാനാദികൾ ഒരുനാളും കൈവിട്ടു പോകുകയില്ല. ശ്രീനാരായണഗുരുദേവൻ തന്റെ എല്ലാ അനുശാസനങ്ങളിലും, അത്യാർത്തി മനുഷ്യനെ കീഴടക്കുന്നുവെന്ന വസ്തുത പ്രതിപാദിച്ചിട്ടുണ്ട്. മനുഷ്യൻ തന്റെ ദുരാഗ്രഹത്താൽ, ഭൂമിയുടെ പ്രതലം മാത്രമല്ല, ഉളളു കൂടി തുരന്ന്, ഭൂമിക്കടിയിൽ വസിക്കുന്ന ജീവജാലങ്ങളെ നിരാധാരങ്ങളാക്കി ഭൂമിയുടെ സന്തുലിതാവസ്ഥയ്ക്ക് ഭംഗമുണ്ടാക്കി. മനുഷ്യർ മറ്റ് ജീവജാലങ്ങളെ അവരുടെ വാസസ്ഥലത്തു നിന്നും ആട്ടിയകറ്റിയതുമൂലം അവ മനുഷ്യർ വസിക്കുന്ന സ്ഥലങ്ങളിൽ കടന്നുകൂടിയതാണ് കോവിഡ് -19 മുതലായവയ്ക്ക് കാരണമായ രോഗാണുക്കൾ ആവിർഭവിക്കാനിടയാക്കിയതെന്ന് സംരക്ഷണവാദികൾ അഭിപ്രായപ്പെടുന്നുണ്ട്. അപൂർവ്വജീവജാലങ്ങളെ സാമ്പത്തിക നേട്ടത്തിനായി കടത്തുക വഴി മൃഗങ്ങളിൽ നിന്നും രോഗങ്ങൾ മനുഷ്യരിലേക്ക് സംക്രമിക്കപ്പെടുകയും ചെയ്തിട്ടുണ്ട്. ചുരുക്കത്തിൽ , മനുഷ്യൻ പ്രകൃതിയെ ബഹുമാനിച്ചാൽ , ആരാധിച്ചാൽ ഈ വിധ മഹാമാരികൾ ഉണ്ടാവില്ലെന്നത് നിശ്ചയം.

ഒന്നാം പദ്യത്തിൽ, മനുഷ്യർ അജ്ഞാതമായതെന്തിനേയോ ഭയപ്പെടുന്നു എന്നത് നാം കണ്ടു. അഞ്ചാം പദ്യത്തിൽ ഗുരുദേവനരുളുന്നത് , അജ്ഞാതശക്തിയായി നാം കണ്ട ദൈവം സർവ്വ പ്രപഞ്ചത്തിന്റേയും സ്രഷ്ടാവാണെന്നതത്രേ. നാമേവരും - സർവ്വചരാചാരങ്ങളും- ആ ശക്തിയുടെ ഭാഗങ്ങളാണെന്ന് പറയുന്നു. അങ്ങനെയെങ്കിൽ അജ്ഞാതമായ ഒന്നിനെയും നാം ഭയപ്പെടേണ്ട കാര്യമില്ലല്ലോ!

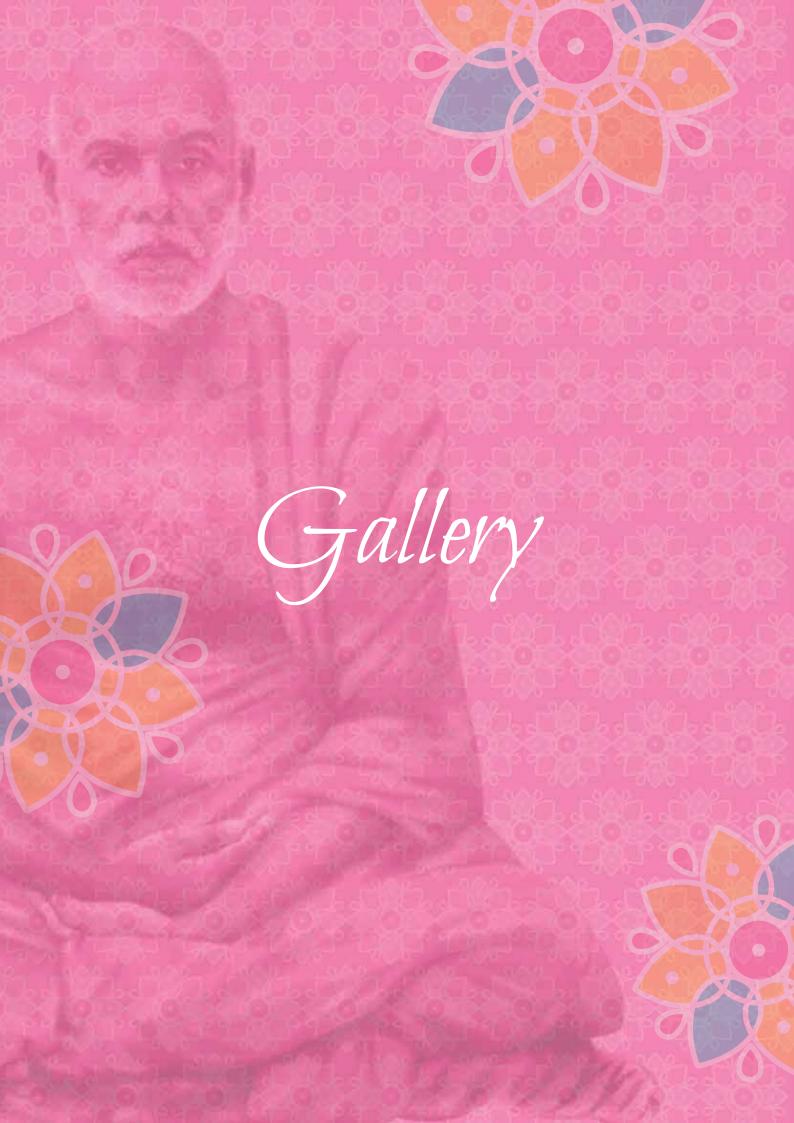

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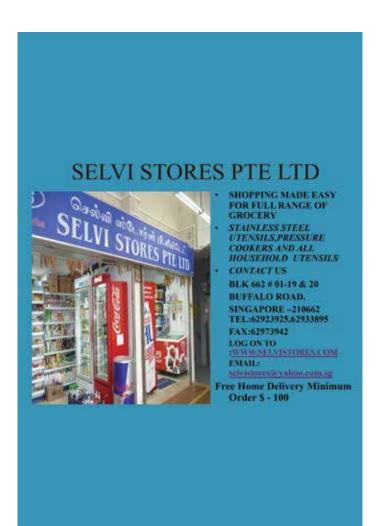

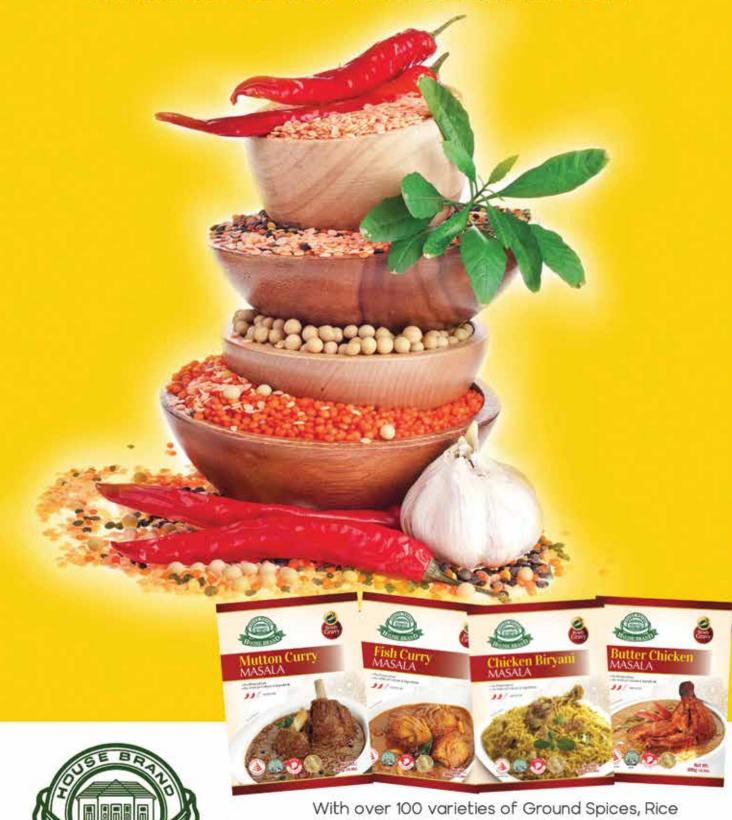


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
