




Happy Guru Jayanthi!

Our organisation has stood the test of time and more recently weathered the pandemic storm to emerge stronger and more united than ever before. Resilience is the hallmark of any organisation that is clear about the purpose of their existence. Guided by Sree Narayana Guru's core values of Daya, Satyam, Dharma, and Shanti, we have existed to empower those around us to lead dignified lives. As a Social Service Enterprise, we are committed in our mission to provide support to the underserved amongst us regardless of race, language, religion or social standing.

We have served the community faithfully for 74 years and are now moving on to our 75th year. Since the very beginning, we have been steadfast in our resilience and agility. This underscored our ability to consistently provide a high level of service to our residents, clients and beneficiaries despite the many challenges that we have faced, and helped us achieve many significant milestones in the long history of our organisation.

More recently, the 75th Anniversary Heritage Walk in June served as a mark of solidarity with 75 people from across our membership, staff and executive committee walking 7.5 km to mark the start of the Mission's 75th anniversary celebrations. We also hosted a get-together during Iftar in April at our Nursing Home for our Muslim friends and partners from the various faiths where we shared a meal. In August, we collaborated with the Sowers of Novena Church and the Order of Malta (Singapore) to bring meals to our beneficiaries in Pek Kio. Meanwhile members and volunteers reached out virtually to those at-risk as tele-befrienders and spent quality time with them to ease feelings of social isolation during the pandemic.

Serving SNM as Assistant General Secretary for two years and General Secretary for a year has made me realise the needs of the elderly on a deeper level. End of life phases can be a struggle. What can we do to relieve the elderly and their families of the stresses? We have started thinking about providing not just sick care but preventive care more systematically with the advent of Healthier SG. We continue to look into the use of robots, private spaces that emulate a home setting and programmes like adaptive sports and mindfulness meditation to improve the mental and physical dexterity of our residents.

In the next phase of our growth, we would like to focus on providing greater quality care to the elderly. This will require more funds and expertise, the widening of our networks coupled with an acute awareness that we will all age one day and we could all do with some support to age with dignity. Let us all do our bit by helping to raise funds, share our expertise and time, voice our aspirations and join networks. By giving, we lift everyone around us and we all become part of our common humanity. We can all give. No amount of money or time volunteered is insignificant as it all adds up and it inspires those around us to give!

SNM is deserving of more resources given our experience in the elder care space. Not only do we have the expertise and take the training of our staff seriously, we share our expertise with other charities as well. As an organisation, we are committed to improving our understanding of the problems of ageing by listening to the experiences of those impacted, we identify potential partners and funders who share our values, and we are always on the lookout for subject matter experts. We are always willing to learn and strive to keep up with the expectations of the elderly as society evolves. Our EXCO members are committed to the cause to the extent that one member even undertook extensive research in the elder care space by carrying out interviews of the elderly. Such commitment to growth is something that we can be proud of. Moreover, with the help of Government land and resources, we have begun building our second nursing home.

As we move forward, Guru's values should be part of all that we do. We should reflect on these values when deciding how we want to use our resources, expertise and voice. Whatever we do must be guided by these values to ensure that everything aligns and we remain true to the values that have been an integral part of the growth of the organisation.

Dear Members,

After almost three years of the C19 pandemic, the nation has started to adapt towards living with COVID-19 as an endemic disease. I am proud to share that Sree Narayana Mission (Singapore) has not only emerged from C19 stronger but has also grown despite all the challenges.

We have adopted innovation through the implementation of new technologies to better streamline our processes and increase productivity all while providing quality care services to our residents, clients, and beneficiaries. These technologies include Ishine Cloud - a system, which transforms SNM's application landscape and cyber security, a Visitor's Booking Kiosk to allow booking of appointments at the Nursing Home and leveraging on robots - Ecobot Scrubber 50 and Disinfection Robot at Meranti Home to reduce the time spent in cleaning and disinfecting common areas of the Home.

Our staff were trained on data protection to identify and manage risks from an operational perspective to ensure that we continue to observe a strict compliance to governance standards. Safeguarding the personal data of our residents, clients, beneficiaries, donors, and members is extremely important so that we remain a charity of choice in the community. We have leveraged much on information technology to enhance our infrastructure and increase the level of productivity for the work we do daily.

Our healthcare staff continue to battle against the infection wave. Maintaining a constant high level of vigilance is taxing on both the mind and body. Staff care forms an important part of our workplan for 2022 - we have implemented leave clearance as part of our goals to ensure staff have access to ample rest. As an organisation, we have a responsibility to look after our staff across SNM (Singapore) who have selflessly sacrificed so much for the care and safety of others and by doing so, it enables us to create and maintain energetic teams that deliver high value.

This has been rewarded – SNM won the award for Best Active Ageing Programme – Community, in partnership with Cycling Without Age Singapore for 'Moving Generations' at the finale of the 9th Asia Pacific Eldercare Innovation Awards 2021 on December 3rd. We were also finalists in two other categories: Best Dementia Care Programme and Best Day Centre Operator. Our staff also won 69 Gold and 32 Silver awards at the Singapore Health Quality Service Awards, and we were a finalist for Operator of the Year - Residential Aged Care at the 10th Asia Pacific Eldercare Innovation Awards. Our Senior Staff Nurse, Ms Ohm Mar from Meranti Home @ Pelangi Village, was also one of the 125 Nurses who received the Nurses Merit Award in 2022, which recognizes exceptional service and contributions in the field of Nursing.

The hard work of our staff helped to bring Singapore from the pandemic stage to the endemic stage and many restrictions have been eased. This has allowed SNM's Community Programmes team to restart physical activities and attend to the psycho-social and physical wellbeing of our clients and beneficiaries. We continue to build social networks and partnerships among like-minded organisations to better identify the vulnerable in society and cast a greater net of services to ensure that no one falls behind.

As always, SNM remains committed to excellence and aims to enrich the lives of those we touch by empowering them to live dignified lives. We are grateful for the strong support from the Executive Committee, Board of Trustees and Sub-Committees as we embark on this journey.





Reflections and Milestones of the SNM

have always been active with the Sree Narayana Mission (SNM) ever since I was a schoolboy. I joined as a Life Member in March 1972 while I was doing my National Service. The subscription fee for Life Membership was \$50 then and it was a one-off payment while Ordinary membership was pegged at \$6 per annum. I was elected into the SNM Executive Committee on 5 February 1978 and continued to serve until 30 June 2002. I like to take this opportunity to reminisce and share some of my fond memories of SNM activities.

Flag Day

In May 1961, the SNM staged its first Flag Day and it so happened to fall on a Saturday. In those days, Saturdays were school days so I had to obtain parental permission to not attend school that day. My sister and I started our collection of donations in the Nee Soon Area early in the morning and we were accompanied by an adult volunteer. We had to carry a tin for the collection of coins (sometimes dollars!). A box, containing saffron paper badges bearing the message of Sree Narayana Guru, was hung around our necks. There were many students like us collecting donations all around Singapore. The street collection came to an end at about 6.00 p.m. and the total collection raised for the day was about \$8000!

Onam and Guru Birthday Celebrations

In 1965, the SNM hosted a week-long Onam and Guru Birthday celebrations from the 6 to 12 September. At that time, the Sree Narayana Mission was located at 48 Soon Keat Road, in Sembawang. A public forum, with distinguished speakers, was held on the last day which served as a befitting climax. I was a student at the Naval Base Secondary School and I attended the event with my father.

The event became part of the annals of the SNM as it was the first public engagement made by founding Prime Minister Lee Kuan Yew after Singapore gained independence on 9th August that year. He had visited the SNM previously in 1963 as part of an Elections campaign and would later attend the Onam and Guru Birthday celebrations again in 1967.

As guest of honour, Mr Lee arrived at the venue at 11 a.m on 12 September 1967 and addressed the crowd after the welcome addresses by then General Secretary Mr Devadasa Panniker and by Mr M K Bhasi, who was the SNM President at the time. Mr Lee spoke in both Malay and English. He spoke with clarity and passion and the large audience (mostly comprising Indians) listened with rapt attention. He left at 12.30 p.m., after presenting bursaries worth \$100 each to ten students.

Students' Forum

The first public forum for students was held during the Guru's Birthday on Sunday, 13 September 1970. It was the first of the many such forums and youth camps to be held. The theme of the forum was "The Conflict of Generations". The Patron of the Sree Narayana Mission and Member of Parliament (MP) for Sembawang, Mr Teong Eng Siong, was present while the Guest of Honour was Inche Mohd Ghazali Ismail, then Parliamentary Secretary to the Ministry of Education. The Forum was well attended by many pre-university students from various schools in Singapore. The panel of speakers comprised of Dr Sharon Ahmat, Dr Gwee Ah Leng, Mr G. G. Thomson, Mr Gerald D'Cruz and Dr Nalla Tan.

It started at 6.00 p.m. and it was a lively session with active student participation, which ended at 9.00 p.m.

The Concert

On Sunday, 27 June 1976, an international "All Stars '76 Charity Show" was organised to raise funds for the Sree Narayana Mission Building Fund at the National Theatre. Resident bands from some of the best hotels performed together during the evening with the likes of Alley Cats from Malaysia, Sweet Charity from Singapore, The New Minstrels from Philippines, Casino from Indonesia, Shiners from New Zealand, Talisman from Karachi, etc. The National Theatre was packed with a young boisterous crowd and the event was sponsored by Texwood Jeans.

Home for the Aged

By end of 1978, the Government's Bases Economic Conversion Division offered the Mission's management with a two double-storied brick building at 87 & 89 Canberra Road, to manage a Home for the Aged. The Home started operations on 18 February 1979 with four residents. A "Sree Narayana Mission Home for the Aged Fund" was also launched. We had a dedicated volunteer doctor in Dr Seng Kwang Meng, who used to see the residents of the Home regularly. Another doctor who helped for many years during the early years was Dr Nadarajan, who used to run a clinic in Sembawang.

By October 1980 there were 51 residents living in the Home and some of them helped the Mission during the annual Flag Days. There used to be many visitors, volunteers and other well-wishers at the Home. Dr Tony Tan Keng Yam, then a Member of Parliament (MP) for Sembawang, used to visit the Home during the Chinese New Year celebrations to distribute 'hongbaos' to the residents. He also declared the Canberra premises officially opened on 22 February 1981, at a ceremony well attended by members of the Mission. The Home remained in this location until 22 October 1983.

On 23 October 1983, the SNM was shifted to a new premise at the former Sembawang Hospital. Some 50 members of the Singapore Armed Forces and 200 members of Chong Hua Tong Tou Teck Hwee, a Chinese Association, joined hands in assisting with the shifting operations. The new premises were completed in June 1993 and residents were moved into the new Home on 6 February 1994.

These are some of my reflections on the journey of Sree Narayana Mission which I have treasured all these years. I am so proud to be part of the SNM traditions, culture, activities and monumental development while walking in the footsteps of my late parents, who were pioneers in the 1950s.

Arriving at Braddell, the old man woke, on cue, and shuffled out, as the doors opened. As the train slowed and stopped at Bishan, the 'executives' alighted, albeit reluctantly. The young man smiled at me. Returning the gesture, I nodded as the train sped on. On reaching Canberra, I stood up, muttered, "Good night!" and began the short stroll home.
